



Navigating Mission Curve™ Evolution

One of the key principals of the **Mission Curve™** process is to start your **New Work** before you have completed your **Current Work**. There is an overlap period called "**Evolution**" which enables you time to figure out where you are headed, make plans and position yourself for your **New Work** while remaining gainfully employed – a beautiful thing! All part of managing risk but it does not come without its own navigational challenges....

- **Failing to Start Your New Work.** This greatly hinders your ability to stay aligned with your **Life Mission**. You have hit the point on your Current Work where you are no longer growing, the start of your decent toward obsolescence. The longer you sit, the more you get lulled into thinking that you will just ride it out and “endure your sentence.” Money and comfort turn into golden handcuffs. You know there is more for you to do, but find yourself rationalizing as your adventure fades away and you produce little kingdom fruit.

Instead, start walking. Experiment. Dabble. Create some movement toward your New Work. Need some training? Need a certification? Make some contacts. Get moving.

- **Jumping Too Soon.** Would you consider Jesus impulsive? He never seemed to be in a rush. Jesus was clear that planning was important, instructing us to “calculate the cost” before beginning construction of a building. Proverbs is full of wisdom about making plans, that we are to search for wisdom and insight as if looking for hidden treasures and consult with wise council before going to battle.

Work hard. Take the necessary time to prepare. Don’t act impulsively. It makes all the difference in the world. We don’t make good decisions when we are rushing.

- **Delaying Your Jump Too Long.** Making the Jump to your New Work can be scary, not just for you, but spouses too. Delaying your Jump can be the consequence. Remember the first time on the high dive? Standing on the edge, staring at the water below, feeling paralyzed. But you have brought yourself this far – you just have to jump!

Yes, make plans, seek council and get moving, eventually you will come to a tipping point and you must jump. There are no perfect conditions. But beware, it is easy to fall into the trap of a 1 for 1 delay. You set a target date

for making your Jump only to find yourself “needing” to do something for your Current Work which leads to a delay in doing something important for your New Work, which leads you to reset your target date. This cascading cycle easily repeats. Months and even years can go by, caught in this spiral. Be careful of making excuses. Instead, create a compelling **Vision** for where you are headed so you are pulled into your adventure.

Living the Adventure God Made You For will require **Jumps**. When you find yourself at the Peak of your **Mission Curve™** it is time to enter **Evolution** by initiating a move toward your New Work. Start walking. Make plans, seek council, prepare for your next battle and set your sights on your compelling **Vision**.
