



### **How Big is Your Rock?**

*“Who are those who fear the Lord? He will show them the path they should choose.” King David| Psalm 25:12 (NLT)*

It's in a river's nature to seek the path of least resistance. As the water careens down the mountainside, it comes up hard against a huge rock, pressure builds and builds. Eventually it finds a way, and resumes a steady flow around the obstacle. The huge rock caused the river to create a new path. If the river comes upon a small rock? Unfettered, it plows on forward, right over it, with no change in direction. Small rocks provide little resistance and don't affect the rivers path.

Imagine now that your life is that river, flowing as you go day by day. Your life will

just stay the course unless you encounter a big rock. Perhaps you have thoughts that life should be more meaningful. *King David| Psalm 18:31*

I have to say that this scripture gives me the willies, more so than anything I am fearful of here on Earth. And that's just it. We should fear God more than anything here on Earth.
